We specialise in preparing students for university entry by providing an extensive range of A Level and University Foundation Programmes and focusing on examination success.

We teach students from 16 years plus (must be non-compulsory school age) in small classes of no more than 8 students per group. Students choose LILA* College because of the quality teaching and the high level of individual attention and support they receive here.

At LILA* College we take great pride in our ability to cater for all educational backgrounds. Our tutors have high

expectations, so all students – including the most able – are stretched intellectually and encouraged to aim high. If students are capable of entering the most competitive degree courses and the most prestigious universities, they have an excellent chance of being successful.

We are proud of our students who achieve top grades, but we are also committed to raising the level of students of differing abilities. We recognise that A Level grade C, for example constitutes a major underachievement for some students, while being a justified cause for celebration in others.

OUR FACILITIES



LILA* Liverpool was founded in 2004 and has gone on to become one of the world's leading international language schools and teacher training centres.

The College is situated in New Barratt House on North John Street, within 5 minutes' walk of James St Station, Paradise Street Bus Station and 10 minutes' walk of Central and Lime St Stations. The college, which occupies around 4,500 sqm is a purpose-built, design-led space filled with natural light and featuring an airy, open-plan layout. The inspiring learning environment is filled with art and each classroom has an individual theme centred around the culture and heritage of Liverpool. Two large common rooms are equipped with kitchen areas, a ping pong table, a foosball table and large screen Smart TVs perfect for students to relax and make friends. There is a well-equipped library and study space for the exclusive use of students on A Level and University Foundation Programmes only.

Designated 'Quiet Areas' provide students with space to work and focus. These can be accessed on an ad-hoc basis or students can book in a time to think and concentrate on the tasks in hand.

The open-plan design and glass walls of the College were designed so that the staff and students get to know each other and to foster the nurturing environment that the College is famous for. Students are encouraged to talk to Academic and Support staff about any issues that may arise during their time at the College.

Our vision is that we inspire and enable our students to love to learn, by creating an open and exciting environment, unlike any they may have experienced before!

OUR VALUES AND ETHOS

The College has structures in place that help develop digital literacy and awareness of key issues around health and well-being.



TEACHING AND LEARNING

Experienced Tutors

All our tutors have a first degree in the subject they teach, and many also hold doctorates, or other postgraduate degrees and teaching certificates. Many of them have worked as examiners with the major A Level examination boards. Our tutors are great motivators. Their dynamic and enthusiastic approach to their subjects inspires our students to work hard and succeed.

Small Classes

Our small classes enable students to form good working relationships with their tutors, and guarantee that all students receive individual attention. In all subjects class sizes are kept small so to ensure that students receive exceptional teaching support and focus.

Academic and Pastoral Support

All students are assigned a Personal Tutor whom they meet regularly and with whom they can discuss any problems or concerns, whether academic or personal. Personal Tutors are responsible for monitoring their students' progress. They work closely with the Principal and provide students with advice about career and university options.

Assessing and Monitoring Progress

By regularly assessing and monitoring students' progress, we ensure they are fully prepared for their final examinations. Progress is assessed by:

- Regular tests using past examination questions
- Regular homework
- Monitoring attendance
- Individual feedback from subject tutors and personal tutors

Emphasis on Study Skills

To help students work more effectively and improve their performance in examinations, teaching on all programmes combines prescribed subject content with tuition in important study skills, such as note-taking, speed-reading, memory skills, good revision habits and time management.

Attendance

Regular attendance is vital to examination success. It is also a safeguarding issue. We therefore monitor the attendance of all students very closely, alerting parents if their child is absent without reason.

Communication with Parents and Guardians

Communication with parents is very important to us, as we see parents as part of the LILA* College Community. We keep the parents of students aged under 18 closely informed as to their child's progress and wellbeing. We hold two Parent's Evenings per year in November and March – these are held both in person and online. Written reports are created for Parents at Christmas, Easter and the end of the academic year for courses that last more than one Academic Year. Parents are welcome to speak to staff at any time about their child's attainment and progress.

The Progression Platform

A unique offer from LILA* College, the Progression Platform is offered to all students. We live in a challenging and ever-changing world, and the Progression Platform equips students to be successful from the moment that they enter that world. From leadership and teamwork to professional communication and dispute resolution; from understanding how to be safe and professional online, to understanding emotional intelligence and interrelationships and understanding modern global media: the Progression Platform is the launchpad for wider success in the real-world for our students.



A LEVELS



At LILA* College we prepare students for entry to higher education by offering a focused range of A Level and University Foundation Programmes. We also run courses in English as a Foreign Language.

We pride ourselves on our flexibility and specialise in providing individual courses of study tailored to each student's particular needs and preferences.

A LEVELS

We offer a variety of A Levels covering a wide range of subjects, all geared to ensuring that you gain the breadth and depth of knowledge required to succeed at University.

A Levels can be studied on 2 different pathways with LILA* College:

Two-Year A Level Courses

Starting in September, this is the 'traditional' two-year route, for those with appropriate GCSE/IGCSE or equivalent qualifications.

Eighteen-Month A Level Courses

Starting in January this is for those who with appropriate GCSE/IGCSE or equivalent qualifications, or who have previously studied AS Levels. Students should note that this is a more intensive programme of study than the two-year pathway.

Students usually choose 3 or 4 A Level subjects. Before choosing, students should think carefully about their combination of subjects and which are the right ones for them. Good reasons for choosing an A Level Subject include genuine interest in or love for the subject, natural ability to do well in that subject, or a particular degree course or career ambition for which certain subjects are required. Poor reasons for choosing a subject would include that your friends are studying it, that you think it is 'cool' or that you have seen something about it on tv or social media. If you are unsure which subjects are the right choice for you, please reach out to us and we can provide advice and support.

We try our very best to ensure that your option choices are accommodated in our timetable, however this is not always possible. In that circumstance, we will ask you for an alternative choice. If a student appears to be considering an inappropriate combination we will provide guidance before any final decisions are made.

The Academic Structure

Our Academic delivery is broadly structured around 3 central curricular themes, with students benefitting from expert teaching from subject specialists.

Science

Our passion for science and innovation informs all of our teaching, delivered from our brand new, state of the art science lab, producing students who are well-prepared and fully-equipped for scientific study at University. We are proud to play our part in educating the world's future scientists, engineers and healthcare professionals.

Humanities and Social Sciences

Study of the Humanities and Social Sciences gives students a deeper understanding of the human and cultural aspects of the world we live in, and is a key part of a balanced education. This discipline creates thoughtful and active global citizens of the future, ready to make a positive impact on the future.

Business and Management

Students will develop the skills, knowledge and qualities needed to unlock a deeper understanding of the many facets of business, finance and management that impact our daily lives, opening multiple study and career opportunities.

In addition to their core scheduled classes, students will also have access to additional opportunities including master classes from industry experts and opportunities to engage with universities and businesses enabling them to create contacts and gain insights designed to expand their horizons and help them focus on and achieve their aspirations in life. One-to-one tuition is also available at an additional cost.

UNIVERSITY FOUNDATION PROGRAMME (UFP)

The University Foundation Programme (UFP) is a one-year, or six-month intense foundation course that prepares students to attend some of the UK's top universities including the members of the Russell Group. Recognised as an A-Level (RQF Level 3) equivalent, the UFP is an alternative route to degree level studies. Founded in 1989, our foundation programme is one of the oldest and most respected independent foundation courses in the UK. Small class sizes and individual support allow our students to perform to the best of their potential. The UFP is a one year, or six-month alternative route to an undergraduate university degree programme. For the past 5 years, over 70% of students graduating from our London campus have received offers from Russell Group Universities. In our first year of operation in Liverpool, 100% of our students received offers from their first-choice universities. Our Foundation Course is recognised by over 90 universities in the UK, so you have the freedom to choose your university.

On this course you will:

- Study six modules, comprising three compulsory and three elective modules
- Be assessed with a blend of progress tests, coursework and exams throughout the year

Please note that the UFP will not qualify you for every degree course or university – for example dentistry, veterinary science and some pharmacy/medicine degrees, nor will it permit you entry into Oxford or Cambridge, all of which still require 3 high grades at A level.

Freedom to Choose

Our independence allows students to consider multiple universities and apply for degrees that best suit them. Throughout the process, our staff can offer extensive educational and career advice. We also allow our students to choose their modules where possible according to their future subject area.

UNIVERSITY FOUNDATION PROGRAMME - PATHWAYS

In Liverpool we offer 4 pathways depending on student choice and volume: (1) Business and Finance, (2) Law & Humanities, (3) Science, and (4) Engineering and Computing. Students may start their UFP programme in September (one-year) or January (six-month intensive). Each Pathway is designed to provide students with an in-depth, practical knowledge of their subjects, and to equip them with the skills and attributes necessary to qualify for entry into the University degree course of their choice. Students are provided with a strong, relevant academic foundation as well as developing their confidence and wider professional skills.

All UFP courses are based on the same compulsory 'minor' modules:

- Core Mathematics,
- Communications/IELTS (Pathway depends on student qualifications)
- Information Technology. (IT)

Students then choose three optional 'major' modules from their chosen pathway. The precise range of available majors will depend on the levels of student interest and resources.

Science Majors may include:

- Biology
- Chemistry
- Physics
- Further Mathematics

Humanities and Social Sciences Majors include:

- Psychology
- Sociology
- Law

Business and Finance Majors may include:

- Business Organisations
- Accounting
- Economics
- Business Finance
- Business Management

Engineering and Computing Majors may include:

- Chemistry
- Further Computing
- Further Mathematics
- Physics

INTENSIVE UFP: BUSINESS & FINANCE / LAW & HUMANITIES

We are very excited to introduce a new and challenging route to success for those interested in university progression in Business & Finance, or Law & Humanities! The Intensive UFP offers the same depth and breadth of teaching and learning with no compromise on teaching hours or subjects covered, delivered in 6-months from January each year.

Students will be able to choose either the Business & Finance pathway, or Law & Humanities pathway but may be restricted as to their choice of majors – for example, it is likely that if you choose the Intensive Business & Finance Pathway that you will be required to study Business Organisations, Accounting and Economics as your majors.

Your first term on the Intense UFP will be busy! You will be studying your three Minor subjects (Core Maths, IELTS/ Communication and IT, alongside the first half of your Majors) and will likely be in scheduled classes on a 9-5 basis, five days per week: just like a professional working day! Your second term will be lighter.

This route is not open to those who wish to take Further Maths, Physics or Further Computing as a major subject.

Steven Gerrard Academy Football Programme optimises:

World-class coaching and training

UEFA-qualified and experienced coaches lead stimulating training sessions designed to improve personal fitness, tactical and technical awareness, team and individual performance. A sport science approach is used to introduce innovative and up-to-date methods and to monitor player performance.

All students play in weekly competitive fixtures

Higher level squads can play in the FA Youth Cup against professional youth academies, compete in the National Football Youth League against professional scholar sides such as Leeds Utd and Newcastle Utd and be invited to play in friendlies against clubs such as Aston Villa FC and Wigan FC. Other squads are entered into local college leagues and cup competitions with the aim of developing players to move into the higher-level squads.

Sports Science

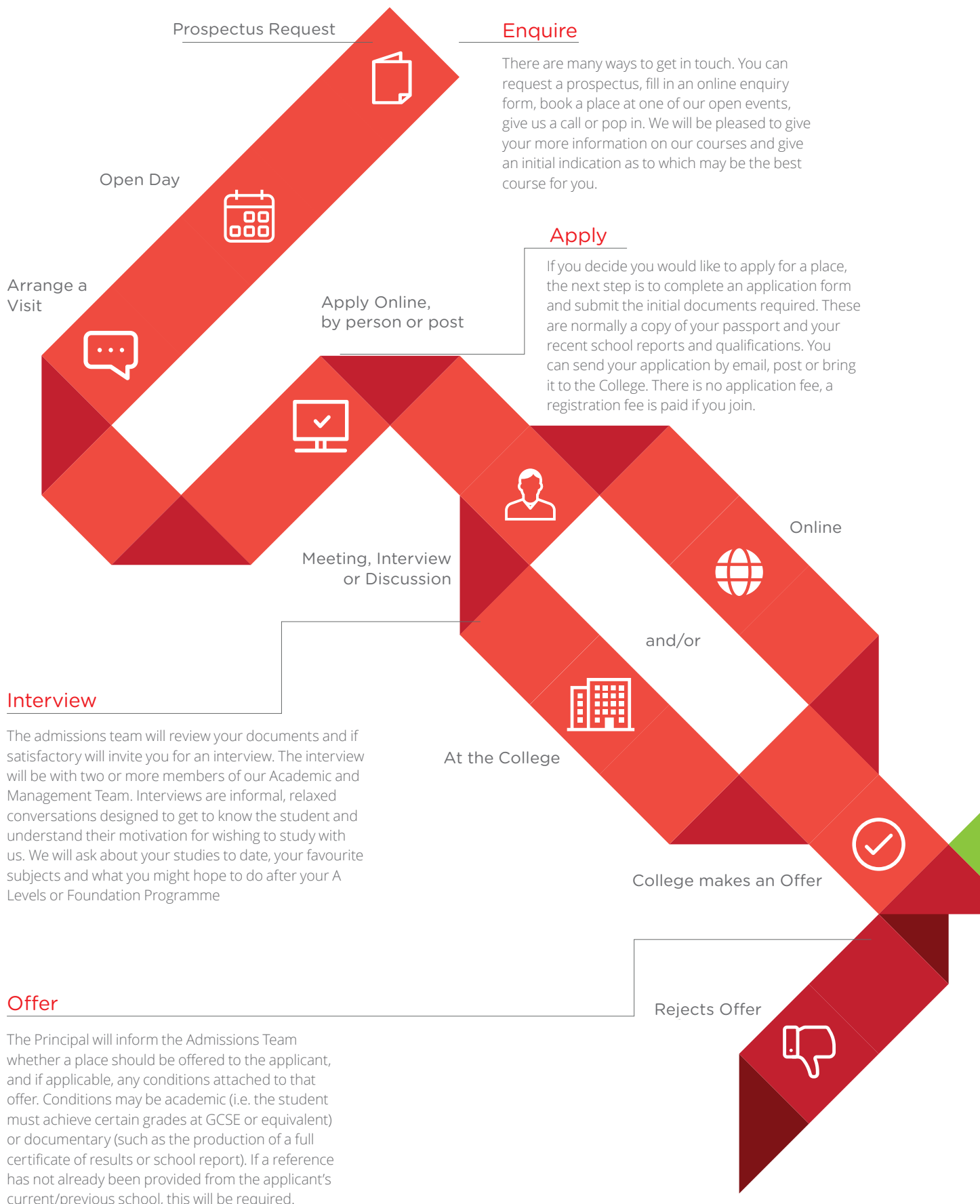
The latest technology and sport science principles develop player performance and coaching. The performance analysis team uses industry-standard analysis software to provide video and statistical feedback to players and coaches. The use of GPS systems allows the coaching team to track players' physical performance, monitor training load and measure performance metrics, such as distance covered to speed and energy expenditure.

Nutrition

To monitor fitness levels before, during and after each season, students complete regular fitness and body compositing testing which helps coaches tailor a programme to each individual player. Advice is provided on nutrition to ensure students are fuelled correctly for training and matches with gym programmes and food plans in place to help them reach their physical goals.

Home Students

1. Confirmation of place and Admission

The Admissions Team will email you to confirm that your payment has been received and that your place is reserved. Useful information and requests for further information will be sent to you, including a Medical and Special Educational Needs form which you will need to complete and return.

2. Entry and Enrolment

Close to the start of your course you will receive information about your first day induction and what you will need to bring for your enrolment and entry into the College. Please note that you will need to bring original documents such as your school certificates and grade transcripts.

International Students

1. Confirmation of Place

The Admissions Team will email you to confirm that your payment has been received and that your place is confirmed. Useful information and requests for further information will be sent to you, including a Medical and Special Educational Needs form which you will need to complete and return.

2. Arrange Accommodation

If you require accommodation, the Admissions Team will put you in touch with the Accommodation Officer to book.

3. Visa Application

If you require a student visa to study in the UK, then the Admissions Team can help you by telling you the documents that you will need for your visa application. The Admissions Team must first check all documents that are to be submitted with the visa application and can provide assistance with the letters you may need. Ultimately though, the legal responsibility for getting the right visa for your studies is yours.

PREPARING FOR UNIVERSITY ENTRY

At LILA* College, we prepare our students thoroughly for their future careers

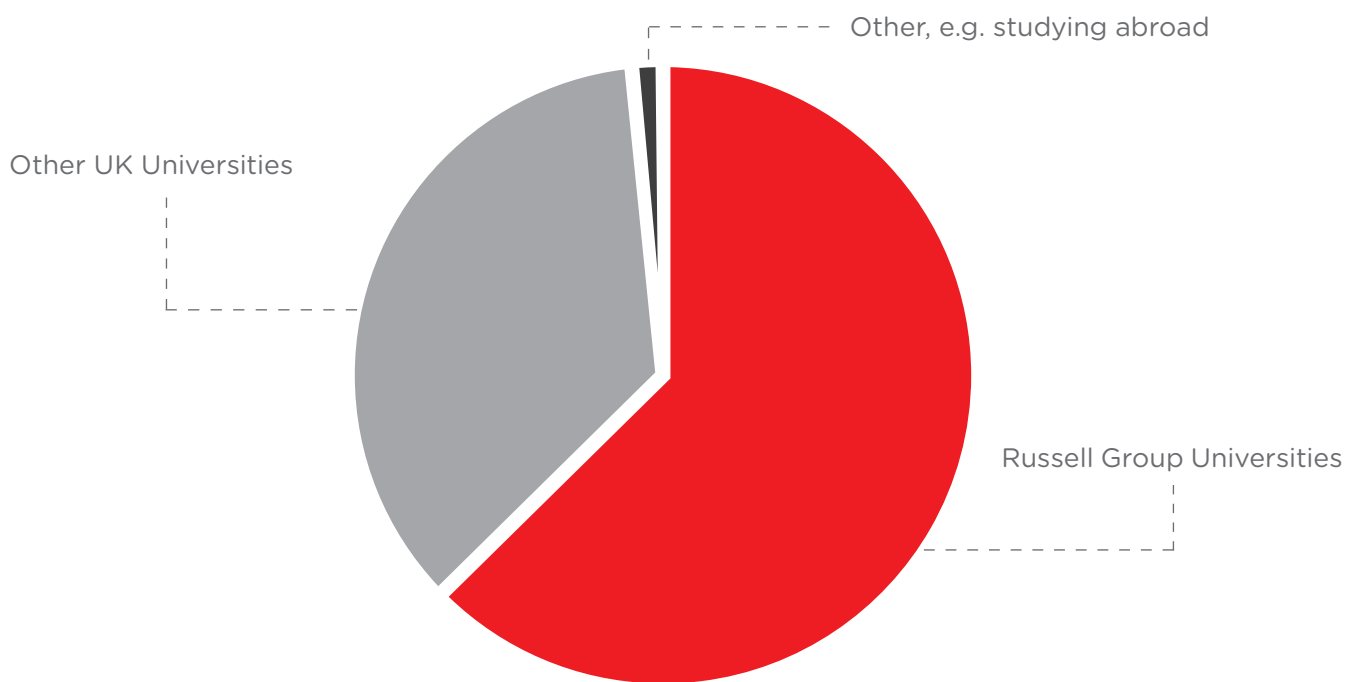
Students wishing to study at a British university are required to submit an application to the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS). We guide our students through every stage of the UCAS application process. Our UCAS Advisors hold regular one-to-one meetings with all A level students, providing them with individual support tailored to their needs that includes specialist advice and information about subject choices and combinations, suitable degree courses and which offers to accept.

Our UCAS Advisors also help students to write an effective personal statement and to complete their UCAS form correctly. Those students who are invited to interview receive coaching in interview techniques and mock interview practice. In addition to supporting students with their UCAS application, our UCAS Advisors offer careers advice and can help students to arrange work experience placements, providing guidance about composing an eye-catching CV and writing a covering letter.

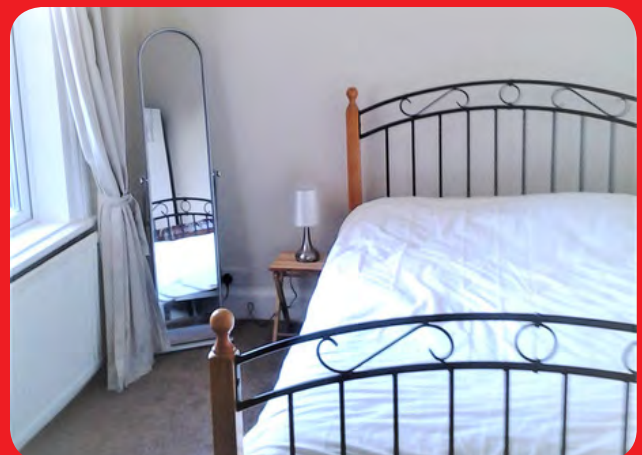
